Hi everyone, March has come. This month, we have the Spring Ohigan Service. Spring has arrived, but there are still some cold days, so please take care of your health. Last month I caught a cold. It reminded me of the words of Saichi Asahara (1850-1932):

l've caught a cold. It's a cold of Dharma. I can't stop coughing. It's a cough of Nembutsu.

Saichi Asahara is a Myokonin. Myokonin is a term used to refer to people who follow the teachings of Jodo Shinshu, and who were especially grateful for the Nembutsu in their daily lives. He encountered the Nembutsu and was delighted that the Nembutsu flowed out of him unintentionally, like a cough when you have a cold.

Reading his words and stories, it seems that he was more self-reflecting than most people and had a sense of gratitude for life and the Buddha. It is important to have a sense of gratitude in your daily life like he did.

The word "Itadakimasu" used before a meal comes from the verb "Itadaku," which is a polite way of saying "Morau," which means to receive. And in Japanese, the top of one's head or the top of a mountain is called Itadaki. So, it is possible that the origin of "Itadakimasu" comes from people holding something they received above their heads to show gratitude.

Although we Gassho and say Itadakimasu before meals, sometimes I forget to Gassho when eating at home or elsewhere. However, even if I forget or if I'm in the middle of eating, I think it's important to remember to be grateful for the food and the people who made the meal possible.

Answer: Bumpy

This looks like a symbol, but it's a kanji character. It's pronounced "Deko Boko." If you change the order of the kanji characters to make it "凹凸," it becomes pronounced "Ou Totsu." It means that the surface has bumps and is not flat.



SANGHA INSIGHTS By Elizabeth Fujii



When I arrived at Mitsuo ("Mits") Yamamoto's home he greeted me with his signature humor by saying "boy, you've gotten to the bottom of the barrel if you're interviewing me!"

Over the next couple of hours I was taken on a wonderful journey through his memories, friendships, and adventures - making this one of the most interesting and enjoyable "Sangha Insights" for me.

Born in Sacramento on February 25, 1926, Mits celebrates his 99th birthday this month. His parents, Tamehachi and Asako Yamamoto, emigrated from Japan and worked as farmers in Sacramento and, eventually, in Elk Grove raising strawberries where

Mits' parents would find him asleep in the cool strawberry ditches.

He was in high school in Elk Grove, at the age of 16, when "life changed drastically." Mits' family was sent to the Fresno Assembly Center and, approximately 4 months later in October 1942, to the Jerome War Relocation Center where he was the first graduating class in camp (Denson High School). He worked various jobs outside of camp, some in cities far away from "home" like Chicago, Philadelphia, Boston, New Jersey, and Florida.

Mits and his wife, Jayne, were married over 70 years. Together, they raised four children (Diane, Gary and Ginny and Glenna). His family has now grown to include 5 grandchildren, and 1 great-grandchild. He enjoyed traveling, visiting Japan "many times", Singapore, China, Australia, Thailand, Washington DC, US National Parks, Niagara Falls, New York (including lunch on the 107th floor of the Twin Towers), and Florida (where he watched the launch of the Columbia Space Shuttle while on a cruise).

In 1988, Mits retired from Campbell's with 39 years of service. Since then, he has written a memoir of his life, and in 1990 he developed a passion for woodworking. He has made toy trains, wood plaques, and inspirational messages gifted to family, and friends, and even for the Sacramento Kings! He has gifted Dharma Wheels which are now hanging all over the world at many US temples, the Nishi Hongwangi in Kyoto, and one was even given to the Dalai Lama in India!

If you were to visit Mits at his house, you would most likely leave with one of his crafted woodworks, like the one he gave me with his motto "Make Someone Smile Everyday". Thank you Mits for sharing your life's story and for making me smile! Have a Happy, Healthy, and Fabulous birthday!

Kikuyo and Kinjiro Nakatani Scholarships 2025-2026

The Buddhist Church of Florin's Kikuyo and Kinjiro Nakatani Scholarship program offers academic financial assistance to our church members' high school and college students with seven scholarships:

- A \$5,000 scholarship and a \$3,000 scholarship to graduating senior high school students; and
- A \$5,000 scholarship, a \$3,000 scholarship, a \$2,500 scholarship, a \$1,500 scholarship and a \$1,000 scholarship to students attending a university, college or vocational school.

Graduating high school students who will be attending full time and/or students attending an accredited college, university or vocational school full time in 2025-2026 may apply for the scholarships. The student's parent(s) or student must be a member of the Buddhist Church of Florin to be eligible for the scholarships.

The evaluation criteria will be:

- Participation in church, community and school activities
- Scholastic achievement
- Essay
- In-person interview

<u>Church Member Parents</u>-Please encourage your children to apply for the Buddhist Church of Florin's Kikuyo and Kinjiro Nakatani Scholarships. Applications will be available from the Nakatani Scholarship Committee, Walter Menda, or Florin Dharma School Superintendent and YBA advisors in January 2025.

Application Deadline: Applications must be received by the Nakatani Scholarship Committee, Walter Menda, by midnight, April 1, 2025.
