[The Light of a Candle]



July is here, and it is the season of Obon. The Hatsubon service is held to honor those who have passed away within the past year. Obon, more broadly, is a time to remember not only those we lost recently, but all those who have passed before us. Many people come to our church during this time, bringing with them the memories of the people who were born into the Pure Land before us.

Among the various offerings placed before the Buddha, such as flowers and incense, there is also the candle. The quiet flame of a candle has a way of calming our mind. When we look at its gentle light, we are invited to pause and reflect. This simple flame teaches us many things.

A candle burns to light the world around it, but in order to do that, it needs to burn its own wax to create light. Just like this candle, some of us donate our time and energy to support others. Parents who worked hard for their families. Members who gave their efforts for the churches, communities or neighborhoods. Their lives were lights that warmed those around them. This kind of giving is not about sacrifice. Rather, it is the joy of lighting up someone else's smile that brings meaning to such a life.

The flame of a candle sways when the wind blows. But it does not go out right away. It trembles, yet holds on. Our hearts are much the same. In times of grief or anxiety, we may feel shaken. But sometimes, a single word or a smile from someone can become the support we need to keep going.

A candle also shines more brightly in the dark. Outside in the daytime, the candle flame is hard to see. But in the darkness, even the smallest flame stands out. Life is similar. In joyful times, we may overlook certain truths. But when sadness or loneliness comes, we begin to see what is truly important. Obon offers us this kind of moment. It reminds us of the fragile nature of life. Even when we go about our daily lives assuming that life will go on indefinitely, Obon gives us a chance to reflect on those who have entered the Pure Land, and on the fact that we, too, are living lives that could end at any time.

The flame of a candle can also be passed to another candle. The original flame does not disappear. It continues to burn, and now there are two lights. In the same way, the kindness and compassion we received from those who

have gone before us remain within us. And we can pass that light to others. This is how life continues, through connection.

Lastly, a candle needs a wick in order to burn. Even with plenty of wax, without a wick the flame cannot be lit. So we must ask, what is the wick within us? What is our center? Who do we live for? What do we truly value? Perhaps those who have gone to the Pure Land before us are the ones who help us find these answers.

When we encounter the teachings of the Buddha, we are given a chance to discover the core of our being. And when we live from that core, we can become a source of light for others as well.

There is a phrase in Shin Buddhism: "jishin kyo ninshin" — "By deepening one's own entrust to the Buddha, we help others to entrust as well." In other words, by living with the teachings of the Buddha and the Nembutsu, we naturally inspire it in others. Just like the flame of one candle lighting another.

The candle on the Obon altar is not just a decoration. It is a message. It quietly reminds us of how to live, and how to carry forward the warmth of those who came before us. This Obon, may we light a candle not only with our hands, but with our hearts. May we reflect on those who have been born into the Pure Land, and allow their warmth to continue shining in our lives. And may we walk this path guided by the light of Amida Buddha.

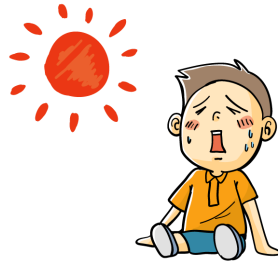

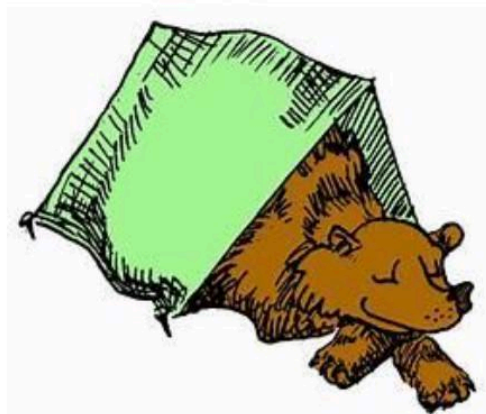

After helping with the parsonage grounds, Harvey then moved to pruning overgrown growth from the trees surrounding the garden.

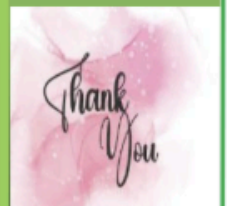
