I hope this Year of the Horse will be a year to notice the support around us, to walk at our own pace, and to live with gratitude and Nembutsu.

"THROUGH RAIN or SHINE" (FOG)

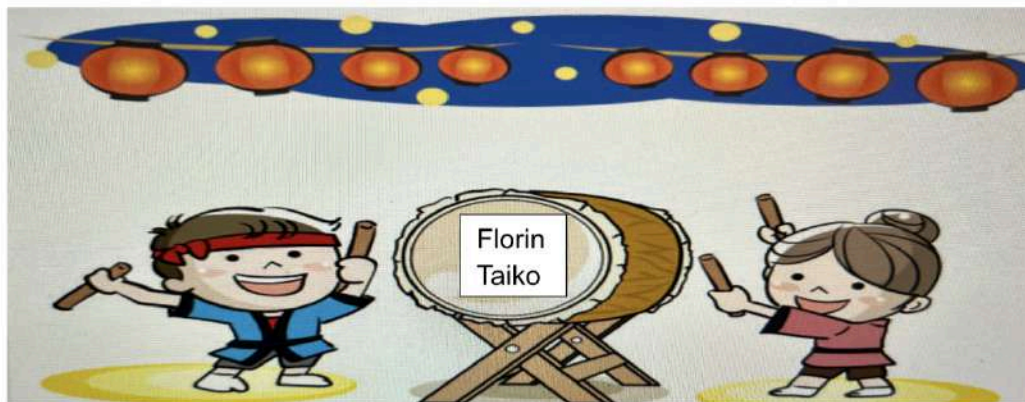

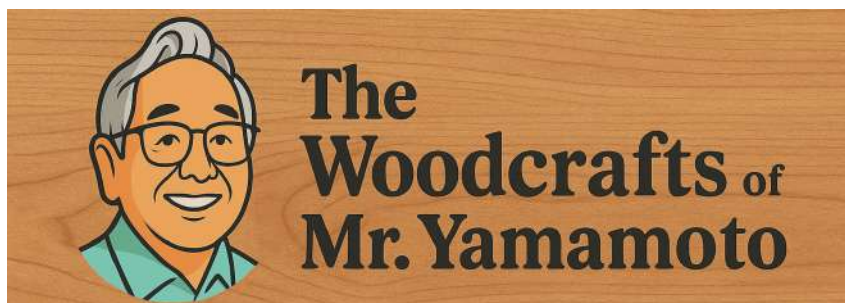

In this issue of our temple newsletter, we would like to introduce a wood-carving artwork by Mits Yamamoto.

Carved into warm, natural wood are the simple words “No Rain, No Rainbow.”

This phrase gently reminds us that difficult times are not mistakes or failures.

In Buddhism, we are taught that life does not always go the way we want.

Suffering and hardship are not something to avoid at all costs, but something to be seen and understood.

Rain is usually something we do not welcome.

However, without rain, the earth cannot be nourished, trees cannot grow, and a rainbow cannot appear in the sky.

In the same way, the challenges we face in life can deepen our compassion, patience, and gratitude.

The wood itself also speaks to us.

A tree grows slowly over many years, shaped by wind, rain, and time.

Only after being carefully carved does it become a work of art.

Our own lives are much the same.

When we feel that we are standing in the rain, this simple message encourages us to keep going.

The sky is always changing.

And sometimes, it is because of the rain that we are able to see a rainbow.
