## **A Quietly Fading Flame: Nehan-e and Nirvana**



February is the month when Buddhists observe Nehan-e, an important Buddhist service.

Nehan-e is the service in which we remember the time when Shakyamuni Buddha (Gautama Buddha) passed away and entered Nirvana.

Shakyamuni Buddha spent many years teaching people. Even at the very end of his life, he continued to speak to his disciples and those around him. His passing is not described as a miracle, but as the life of someone who lived, aged, and died, just as we do. At Nehan-e, we do not simply mourn the Shakyamuni Buddha's death. Rather, we quietly reflect on an important truth, all life will come to an end. And because life is limited, we ask ourselves how we are living this life right now. In Jodo Shinshu Buddhism, we do not see the Shakyamuni Buddha as someone who saves us. Instead, we respect him as a great teacher who revealed and shared the Dharma, the truth of Amida Buddha, with this world. Nehan-e is a precious opportunity to remember his compassion and guidance. In the busyness of everyday life, Nehan-e invites us to pause, to reflect on the preciousness of life, and to spend a quiet moment in gratitude.

Here, let us take a moment to look at the word Nirvana. The word Nirvana comes from an ancient Indian language and is translated into Japanese as Nehan. Nirvana means a state in which the activities of the mind that create suffering and confusion have completely come to rest. It is often misunderstood as heaven or the afterlife, but Nirvana is not a place. It describes a way of being, a condition or state. After the Shakyamuni Buddha awakened to enlightenment, he did not leave this world right away. Instead, he chose to remain in this world to share what he had realized with others who were suffering. Because of this decision, we are able to encounter the Buddha's teachings even today. Eventually, the Shakyamuni Buddha reached the end of his physical life. This moment is called Parinirvana, or entering Nirvana. This is the event remembered during Nehan-e. Nirvana does not mean that everything disappears or becomes nothing. It is often compared to a candle flame. When a candle goes out, the flame does not go anywhere, it simply stops because the conditions that kept it burning have ended.

In the same way, Nirvana describes the complete stilling of the fires of attachment and delusion. After awakening, the Shakyamuni Buddha remained in this world to teach fully and without holding anything back. When his physical life came to an end, he entered complete Nirvana. Because of his long journey and compassion, we have been given the opportunity to hear and live the Buddha's teachings. Nehan-e is not only a service to remember the Buddha's passing, it is also a time for us to quietly reflect on our own lives, and to ask ourselves how we are living here and now.







### Yakusoku



The introduction of artist Mitts Yamamoto's work began last August, and this is the seventh time we are pleased to feature his work.

Each piece gently invites us to pause and reflect in the midst of our everyday lives.

This time, we are introducing a wooden artwork carved with the word "yakusoku," meaning promise.

Written in hiragana, the word does not insist or explain itself.

Instead, it quietly rests before us and invites us to stop for a moment and listen.

In Buddhism, a promise has a very deep meaning.

**Amida Buddha is the Buddha who made a vow to bring all living beings to the Pure Land and became a Buddha through that vow.**

**It is a promise that is not limited by time or place.**

**It reaches people living in every age and in every part of the world.**

**Amida Buddha vowed to create a Pure Land where all living beings may be born.**

**If that vow could not be fulfilled, Amida declared that he would not become a Buddha.**

**This powerful promise reaches us today in the form of the words Namo Amida Butsu.**

**When we recite the Nembutsu, it is not something we accomplish by our own effort.**

**It is the moment when Amida Buddha's promise is being fulfilled right here and right now.**

**Through the warmth of wood and the gentle shape of the word "yakusoku,"**

**This artwork reminds us not of a promise we must make, but of a promise that has already been given and continues to support us.**

**It invites us to pause and remember the vow that is always reaching us.**

## Sho San Shiki (Hatsu Mairi)

May 10 at 10am



Sho San Shiki (First Temple Visit) / Gotan-e / May Shotsuki / Mother's Day / Family Service will be held on May 10, 2026 at Buddhist Church of Florin.

Sho San Shiki literally means "the ceremony of a child's first visit to the temple." In this special service, children wear ceremonial robes for the first time, receive an Onenju, break a kusudama (Japanese Piñata), receive sweets, and take commemorative photos. It is a joyful celebration marking their first connection to the Dharma.

This ceremony is a way to report the birth of a child to the Buddha and to take the first step in raising them within the Buddhist tradition. It is also a meaningful moment for parents as they begin their journey of parenthood in the light of the Dharma, expressing gratitude for the preciousness of life.

Gotan-e celebrates the birthday of Shinran Shonin. Let us remember Shinran as a young child who took tonsure and became a Buddhist monk at age nine, and celebrate Mother's Day in appreciation of all parents and caregivers.
