A Life Changed by an Encounter with the Dharma



In May, we observe Gotan-e, the celebration of the birth of Shinran. It is a special opportunity to reflect on his life and teaching. Shinran's life was greatly changed by an encounter, his meeting with Honen Shonin. After many years of strict practice on Mount Hiei, he found himself unable to attain enlightenment and filled with deep uncertainty. It was through meeting Honen, who taught that one should simply recite the Nembutsu and entrust oneself to Amida Buddha, that Shinran came to a new understanding. This encounter led him to realize the importance of the Nembutsu, and eventually the teaching of Jodo Shinshu took form.

In our own lives, we may also experience encounters that change everything. We might look back and think that if we had not met a certain person, or if we had not gone to a certain place, our lives today would be completely different. I was born into a temple family, and from a young age, Buddhism was always present in my life. I would do Gassho, and by watching my parents, my grandmother, and the members of the temple, I naturally learned to recite Namu Amida Butsu. However, when I went to school, I realized that I was the only one living that way, and there were even children who made fun of Buddhism. Still, when I returned to the temple, I saw members visiting graves, attending services, chanting together, and listening to Dharma messages, and Buddhism was simply a natural part of that space.

Even so, I was the only child there. My younger sister did not come to the Hondo and stayed in her room playing, and I remember asking my parents why I had to attend while she did not. They simply replied that she did not have to, and looking back now, perhaps there was an expectation that I would one day become a minister. Despite that, I did not dislike being in a place where people gathered, and I continued to attend services, growing up surrounded by adults without feeling out of place. Later, when I entered a Buddhist school, I met many others from temple families across the country who had grown up with similar experiences. This was a significant encounter in my life, as I realized that there were many people like me. Even though we shared similar backgrounds, each person was different, and it felt as though the world of the temple, my own life, and the world of people my age had finally connected.

When I entered the school, a teacher told us something unusual, that we would graduate more foolishly than we were when we entered. At first, this sounded strange, but in Jodo Shinshu, the starting point is to realize how limited and foolish we truly are. No matter how much effort we make, we cannot attain enlightenment by our own power, and yet we are embraced by Amida Buddha just as we are. To come to deeply feel this truth was what the teacher meant, and this too was an encounter that changed my life. Shinran himself described human beings as Bombu, beings filled with blind passions who cannot attain enlightenment on their own. Because of this, the teaching that we are led to the Pure Land just as we are carried a deep meaning. Rather than ignoring our weaknesses and struggles, we face them honestly and continue to live, and this may be the path of those who follow the Nembutsu.

Such encounters are never something we should take for granted.

"How difficult it is to encounter this great vow, even over many lifetimes it is rare to meet it, true entrusting is also extremely difficult to attain, now that we have encountered the teaching and the Nembutsu, we should rejoice in the deep causes and conditions from the distant past."

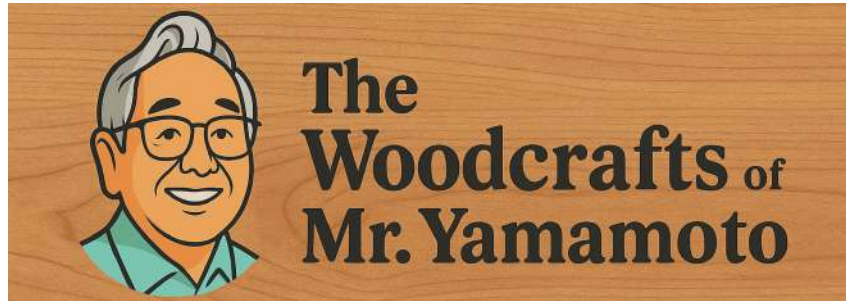

On this occasion of Gotan-e, we hope this piece helps us reflect on how we are also slowly changing through realization and appreciation in our own lives.

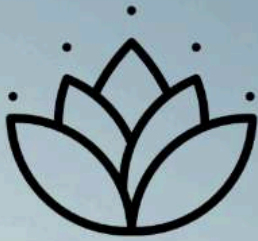

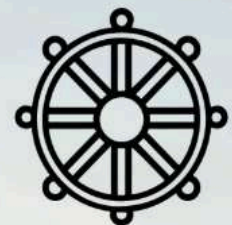
